

'Matilda' worksheet

Refers to **Chapter 13: Themed lessons: Potatoes, turmeric and stickers** on page 282.

Content

A face template for learners to colour in using natural roots, leaves, stems and berries

Rationale

You will find a detailed explanation of the activity in **Lesson commentary 2** on pages 282–290.

This template differs slightly from the one shown in the chapter in that it includes the colour blue, which can be obtained from blueberry skins.

The template is in modifiable so that you can alter the text to include the natural materials you have available or ones that you think are most suitable for your class.

For example, you may decide that fresh turmeric is not a good idea as it stains anything it comes in contact with, sometimes permanently. So you might wish to replace that with green from spinach leaves or brown from basil leaves.

This is Matilda's face.
We are going to colour her.
First, we colour her eyes blue and
her smiling mouth red.

The beetroot stems give us red.
