

# Microphone code visuals

Refers to **Chapter 3: Teaching live online: set up, management and support** on page 21.

## Content

A set of visuals that you can print out in colour. Then cut around the shapes and put each one on a stick. Then you can hold up the labelled sticks as signals for your class each time you teach live online.

## Rationale

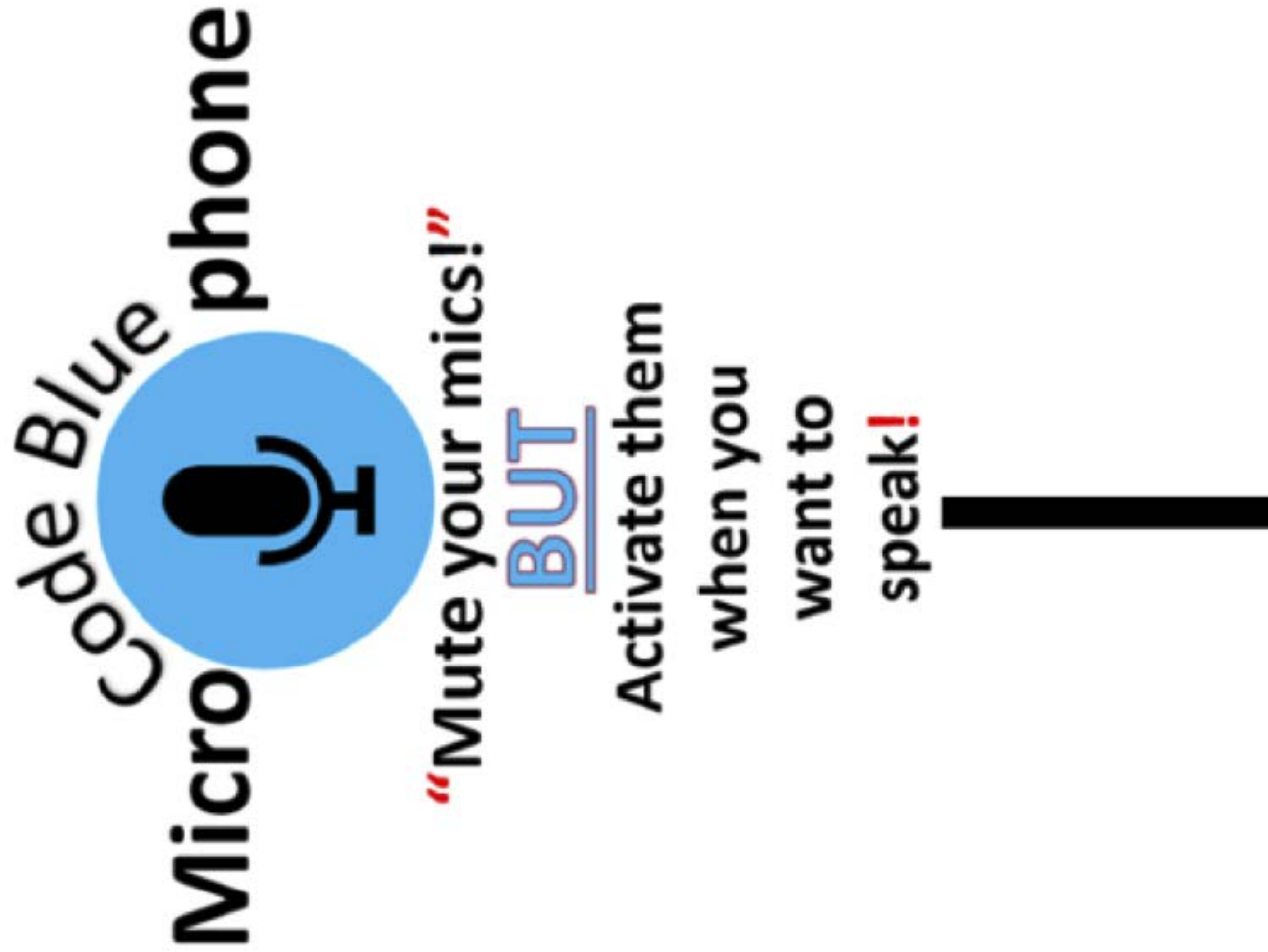
These lollipop signs can be used to add an element of novelty into your classroom management.

It is recommended that you print them out in colour so the learners can identify which type of stick matches which instruction quickly. The colours of blue, green and pink were chosen deliberately so as not to be confused with the idea 'green is good', 'red is wrong' marking patterns some teachers use and/or as warning signs by other teachers when dealing with behavioural issues. Removing the potential negative connotation means these visuals can be used in a light-hearted way, for instance, when the whole class is going to be listening to a song or some music together.

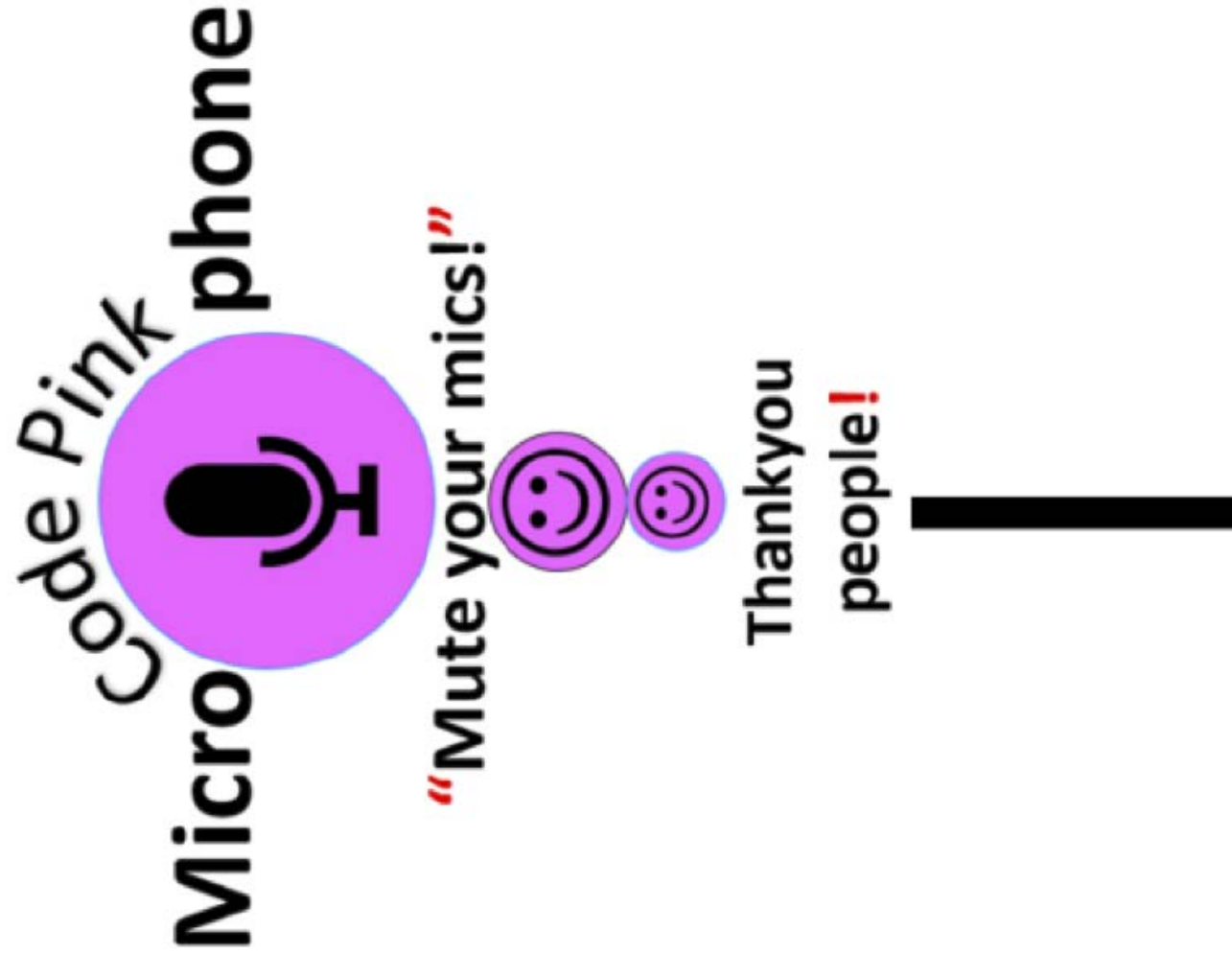
